	Risk 7 - Standards and Delivery of Education - Curriculum and teaching and learning.		
	Inadequate consideration of the curriculum may lead to a poor-quality curriculum which does not enable students		
	to make the progress they should. Inadequate focus on the quality of teaching may lead to students not making the		
	progress they should. This may lead to students being left with limited options in further education or career		
	choices, leading to lower student intake in the future and reputational damage including poor OFSTED judgement.		



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Risk 8 - Standards and Delivery of Education – Examination Results.

Poor examination results lead to reputational damage, resulting in lower student take up rates and financial damage.

Risk 10 - Standards and Delivery of Education - Use of SEND and Disadvantaged Pupil Funding

SEND funding and Disadvantaged Pupil funding does not demonstrate impact on pupil outcomes.
