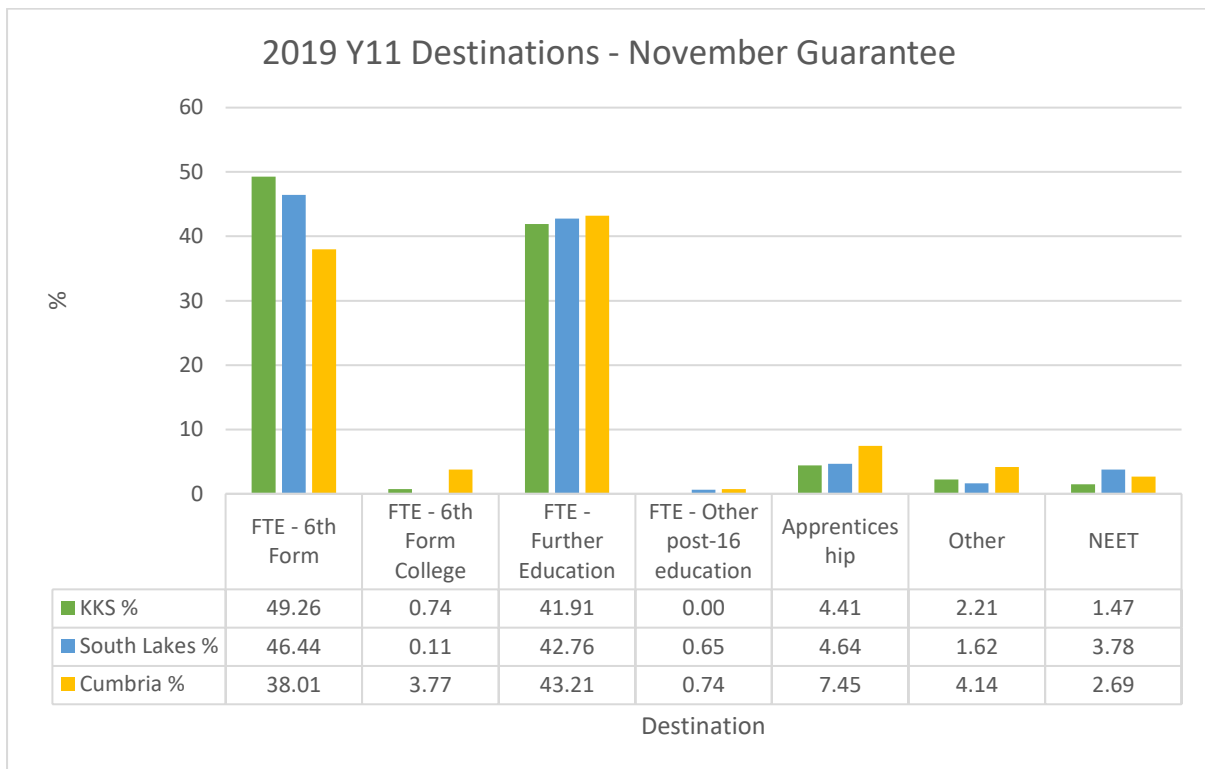
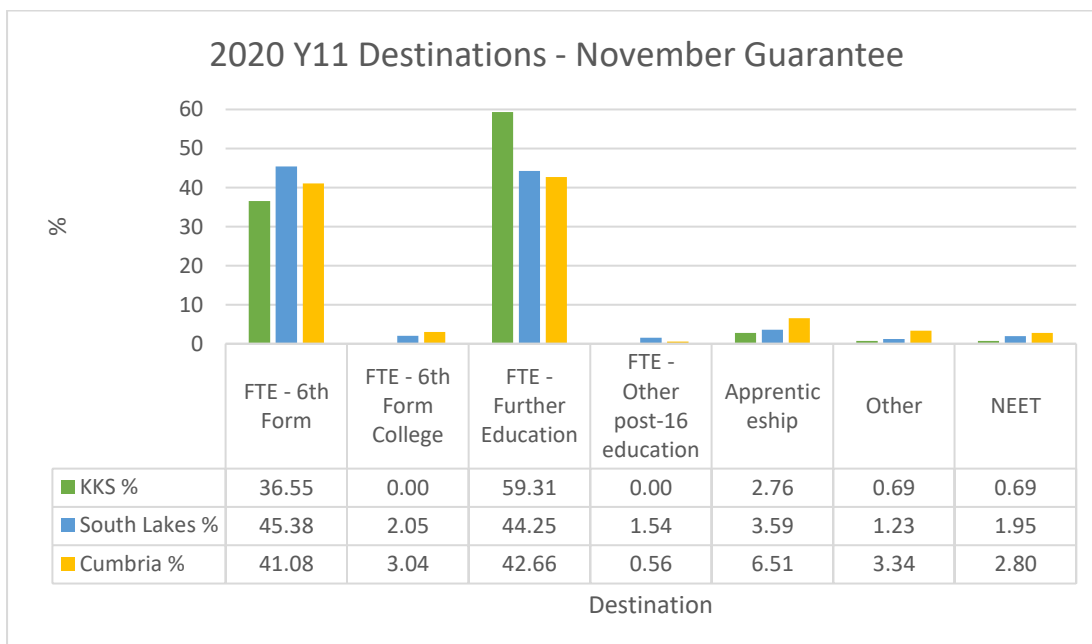


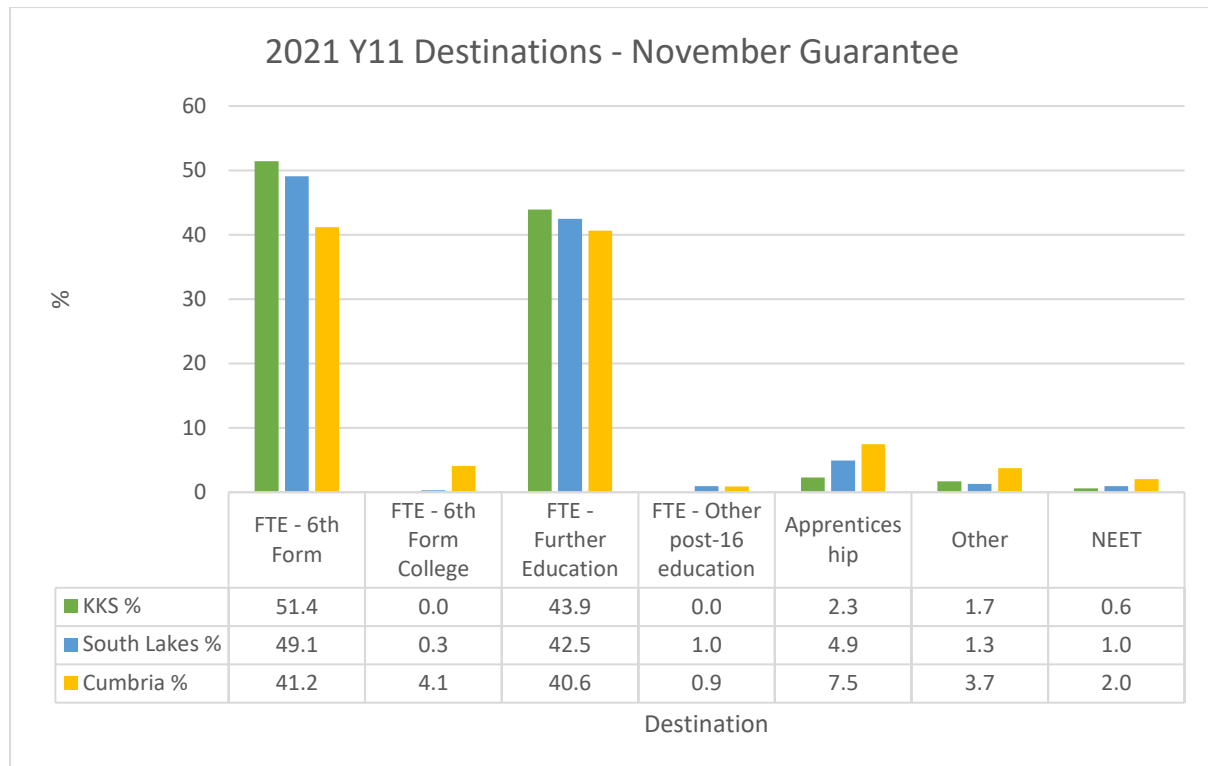
Year 11 Destinations 2019-2023



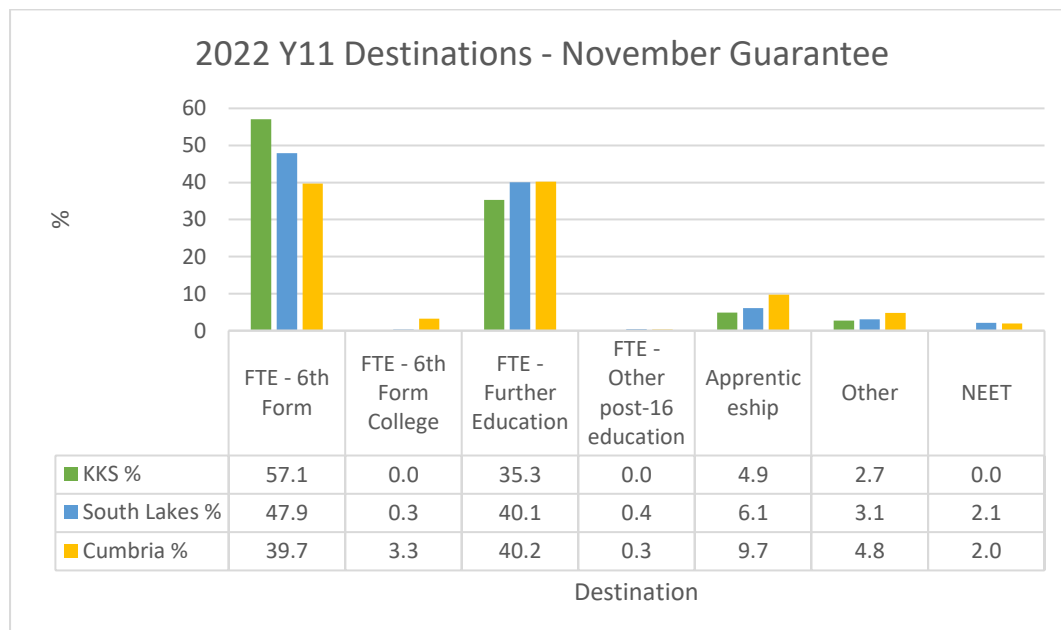
The number of KKS students attending 6th form is slightly higher than South Lakes and considerably higher than the Cumbrian average. The number of students attending further education is broadly in line with KKS, the local area and Cumbria. The number of KKS students taking apprenticeships is slightly lower than local and county numbers. The number of KKS NEETS (students not in education, employment or training) is lower than the average.



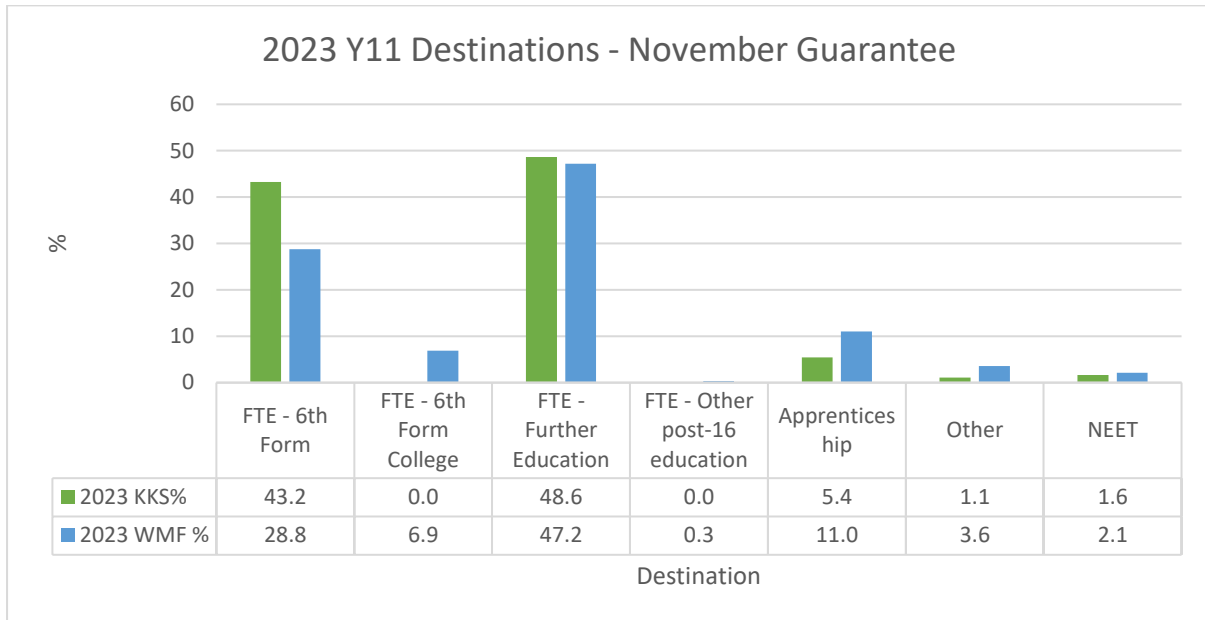
In 2020, the number of KKS students attending 6th form was noticeably lower than the local area and Cumbria with 59% attending College instead. The number of KKS students taking apprenticeships continues to be slightly lower than the local and county average. The number of KKS NEETS continues to be lower than the local and county average.



In 2021 the number of KKS students attending 6th form increased on the previous year. The number of KKS students taking apprenticeships continues to be lower than the local and county level. The number of NEETS also continues to be lower than the county average.



In 2022 the number of KKS attending 6th form was noticeably higher than previous years with less students attending College. The number of students taking apprenticeships continues to be lower than the local area and county. There were no NEET students last year.



The November Guarantee now includes Westmorland & Furness data so a direct comparison with the county and Cumbria data cannot be made. The number of students attending sixth form is noticeably higher than WMF but is slightly less than previous years. Year 11 KKS leavers attending college is inline with WMF data, while the number of students taking apprenticeships is slightly lower than WMF. However, this is the highest percentage we have had for KKS students taking apprenticeships. The number of NEETs is lower than the WMF average.
